## BOONE AT A GLANCE

Boone is a true mountain town—not a "mountain-themed suburb." It's cooler, outdoorsy, and full of personality. It also has a built-in heartbeat thanks to Appalachian State University, which keeps the town lively year-round.

- Population: about 20,080 (Boone town estimate, July 1, 2024).
- College town energy: App State enrolled 21,798 students in fall 2025, which strongly shapes rentals, traffic patterns, and the local vibe. Today
- Easy-ish access: Boone is positioned within a three-hour drive (or less) from major cities and airports, per the official area tourism site. Boone
- Getting around town: App State references AppalCART as a fare-free bus option serving Boone/Watauga County (useful for students and some in-town living). and Event Services

## PEOPLE MOVE HERE FOR:

Cooler summers and a true four-season feel

A lifestyle built around trails, views, and outdoor time

A town that feels friendly, quirky, and real

Quick access to Blue Ridge Parkway drives, overlooks, and hiking

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## **BOONE — WHAT'S DIFFERENT HERE (THE STUFF YOU ONLY LEARN LOCALLY)**

- Appalachian State University shapes housing + traffic — the rental market, move-in/move-out weeks, and game weekends can noticeably change availability and drive times.

It runs cooler than most of North Carolina because of elevation, so “four seasons” feels more real here (and heating costs can be different than people expect).

- Winter driving is highly property-specific — the same neighborhood can feel easy or difficult depending on driveway steepness and whether the sun hits it (shaded driveways stay slick longer).
- “Boone address” can still mean outside town limits — rules, services, and even internet reliability can shift once you’re out of the core.
- Student rental pockets feel different than family pockets — street-by-street vibe matters more here than in many markets.
- Outdoor access is part of daily life — trails, parkway drives, and weekend tourism can influence traffic patterns seasonally.
- Who it’s best for: Buyers who want a true mountain-town lifestyle with energy, seasons, and year-round outdoor access.

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## **THE BEST PARTS OF LIVING IN BOONE**

### **1) YOU GET THE MOUNTAINS WITHOUT GIVING UP “TOWN LIFE”**

Boone isn’t just cabins in the woods. You’ve got downtown energy, local restaurants, coffee shops, and reliable amenities.

### **2) OUTDOOR LIFE IS NOT A “SPECIAL OCCASION” HERE**

The Blue Ridge Parkway is a signature part of the Boone area experience—scenic drives, overlooks, and hiking access are a big reason people fall in love with the High Country.

### **3) THE SUMMERS FEEL LIKE A SECRET (ESPECIALLY IF YOU’RE COMING FROM HEAT)**

Boone’s typical year-round temperatures are often described as ranging roughly from the mid-20s to upper-70s

(rarely extreme heat), which is a huge draw for people moving from hotter climates. Weather

## 4) THERE'S CULTURE HERE—NOT JUST SCENERY

App State brings energy, sports, arts, performances, and a steady stream of “things to do.” (It keeps Boone feeling alive even when it's cold outside.) Today

## “BE HONEST WITH ME” TRADEOFFS (BECAUSE MOUNTAIN LIFE IS REAL)

Boone is amazing—but it's not for everyone. Here's what I'd want you to know up front:

Winter driving is a factor. You may deal with snow/ice days, steep driveways, and mountain roads.

(Totally manageable—just plan for it.)

Tourism + game days can change traffic and restaurant wait times.

- Internet and cell service can vary outside town limits—if you work remote, we verify this early.
- Housing styles vary wildly: in-town neighborhoods, cabins, condos, mountain estates, and everything in between.

## BEST AREAS TO LIVE NEAR BOONE (HOW TO CHOOSE)

Here's the truth: the “best” area depends on your lifestyle, not someone else's opinion.

Before you pick a zip code, answer these:

Do you want in-town convenience or privacy/space?

Are you okay with steeper roads and longer drive times for views?

Do you want newer/low-maintenance or rustic/charm?

Will you be here full-time, part-time, or investing?

## A SIMPLE WAY TO DECIDE (MY FAVORITE METHOD)

Pick your top 2:

1. Daily life (grocery runs, coffee, gym, school routines)
2. Your comfort level with mountain access (steep roads, winter conditions, distance)

Then we match areas to you.

## NEIGHBORHOOD + AREA GUIDE (RELOCATION-FRIENDLY “STYLES”) IF YOU WANT CONVENIENCE + WALKABILITY + EASY DAILY LIFE

Think: closer to downtown Boone, easier roads, quicker access to groceries, restaurants, and campus events.

- Best for: families, professionals, people who want “mountain town” without feeling remote

## IF YOU WANT NEW CONSTRUCTION + MODERN LAYOUTS

New builds exist in pockets—some close-in, some farther out. The big question is location + road access + HOA comfort level.

- Best for: buyers who want fresh + functional + lower maintenance

## GETTING HERE + AIRPORTS (SIMPLE VERSION)

Boone doesn’t have a major commercial airport in town, so most people fly into a regional airport and rent a car.

Two common options people use:

Tri-Cities Airport (TRI) serves Western North Carolina among other areas.

App State notes it’s served by four major airports (useful if you’re comparing flight options). and Event Services

## COST OF LIVING + HOME PRICES (WHAT TO EXPECT)

Prices change weekly in the High Country—and Boone can vary a lot by: in-town vs. out-of-town location road access and winter drivability view lots vs. non-view lots cabin/condo/new construction vs. older

homes
